PROGRAM OVERVIEW

First Nations Development Institute recognizes that accessing healthy food is a challenge for many Native American children and families. Without access to healthy food, a nutritious diet and good health are out of reach. To increase access to healthy food, we support tribes and Native communities as they build sustainable food systems that improve health, strengthen food security and increase their control over Native agriculture and food systems. First Nations provides this assistance in the form of financial and technical support, including training materials, to projects that address agriculture and food sectors in Native communities.



PROGRAM GOALS **2022**

Nourishing Native Foods & Health

- **Goal 1:** Support Native Communities' food system needs in response to Covid-19 by building food system capacity and establishing stronger control over the food chain.
- **Goal 2:** Invest in emerging organizations/programs that draw on cultural lifeways, traditional foods, and Indigenous knowledge.
- **Goal 3:** Create strong Native food economies that support the private (Native entrepreneurs), Native non-profit, and Tribal government sectors.




Current Food System Understandings

NAFSI Questions


We asked grantees: (Over the course of 4 years and 122 grantees from all different regions within our network)



Mainstream Food System




- The underlying frameworks require different approaches.
- Most importantly, the different frameworks require different kind of measurements.
- Mixing measurements creates inefficiencies, confusion, and even resistance

Program Activities

- Build capacity of Native producers by establishing the Beginning Farmers and Ranchers Apprenticeship Program
- Stewarding Native Lands Program
- Improve learning networks through the Indigenous Food
 Systems Community of Practice and Native Fundraisers Community of Practice
- Create learning opportunities for youth leaders though the NAFSI Scholarship and Native Farm to School
- Implement the Food Sovereignty Assessment and Business of Indian Agriculture online
- Fund Breastfeeding & First Foods initiatives and collaborate with Tribal Colleges for research and advocacy
- Explore the Native Hemp and Fiber markets to support Changing Native Food Economies
- Support organizational capacity building for the California Tribal Fund
- Promote GATHER Film and food sovereignty education
- The Food Sovereignty Summit











Program GOALS/Recommendation from the field

- Localize Reponses (flexibility within grant programs, no one size fits all approach)
- General Operational Financial Support
- **Program Delivery** –Technical Assistance (Technical capacity, facilitation, expert in field)
- Grantmaking Practices (relational) Respond to grantee feedback by experimenting with verbal and collaborative reporting models.
- Strength based models not deficient models (all about the language)
- Food is connected to other parts of the food system so also fund other activities that may not be specifically be food focused
